## First of its Kind Training in Building & Facilities Services for PWIDs



**Singapore, 16 July 2018** - Association for Persons with Special Needs (APSN), a social service organisation, embarks on a first of its kind Building & Facilities Services training for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (PWIDs), with Aegis Building and Engineering Pte Ltd.

This Building & Facilities Services programme is the newest course offered at APSN Centre for Adults (CFA), for trainees aged 17 and above. Conducted by both Aegis in-house trainer with relevant expertise, and experienced APSN Instructors who cater to the learning needs of the beneficiaries, this alliance prepares PWIDs with the necessary skills to seek future employment.

After completing the nine-month pilot course in 2019, successful trainees would be offered gainful, full-time employment with Aegis, a local building and engineering firm.

The first pilot course has commenced since 2 July 2018, and 10 trainees were selected after an initial assessment of their aptitude and interest in Building and Facilities Services. Similar to trainees in APSN CFA's Enterprise Programmes, the 10 trainees are paid an allowance for the first three months under the programme.

One of the trainees selected for this programme is Ng Yi Feng. Previously from the Bakery Enterprise, the 27-year-old since made the decision to switch to Building & Facilities Services instead. He said, "I have interest in painting, so I want to get an actual job in which I can paint."

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


Painting is one of the skills taught within the programme curriculum, and Yi Feng hopes to be able to put these skills to good use by decorating his own living space with a design and theme.

Following the initial training phase, they undergo a six-month apprenticeship with hotel partners such as JW Marriott Hotel Singapore South Beach, Shangri-La Hotel Singapore and Shangri-La's Rasa Sentosa Resort & Spa. With their new skillsets, trainees start to earn an income of \$1,100 (with Central Provident Fund contribution), and continue to be supported by APSN CFA Instructors and Job Coaches.

This model in providing structured training for persons with special needs is a way to plug the labour shortage in this sector. Aegis Managing Director, Mr Yeong Wai Teck said, "We believe that the skills acquired by PWDs will be useful for their future employment, which also benefits the local industry. We intend to make this project sustainable over a long period, and in time to come, duplicate this model overseas by transferring the know-how to PWDs there."

APSN Chief Executive Officer, Dr Christopher Tay said, "We are grateful for this joint partnership with Aegis, which has proven how injecting industrial expertise and employment prospects are key to empowering persons with special needs to lead full and independent lives. APSN will continue to usher in such opportunities for our trainees, in new areas, to increase the relevance of their skill set."
