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Home-School Collaboration Building a respectful community



Parents want their children to behave respectfully. One way to do so is by modelling it. Consider these tips:

1. <u>Be a mirror</u>

Your child looks up to you for guidance, so model the behaviour that you expect. For example, if your child sees you being calm when you are stressed or angry, he/ she will be more likely to do so as well when upset. Make it a point to talk through your actions. You might say, "I had a difficult customer at work, earlier. I am going to relax by reading a book and having a hot cup of tea."

2. <u>Make rules together</u>

Children find it easier to remember and follow rules that they have a role in creating. Sit down together with your child and create a list of pro-social behaviour. Be sure that your child understands the reason behind each rule. For instance, ask, "Why shouldn't we use unkind words when we are angry?" (Because someone could get hurt by our words)

3. <u>Highlight success</u>

Emphasise the good feelings that your child gets when he/ she is being respectful. Take a moment to praise your child. Doing so gives your child a sense of accomplishment. That feeling of pride will encourage children to repeat the behaviour in the future.




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Unified Arts: Community Inclusion through Arts
