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At Katong school, we adopt Positive Behaviour Interventions and Supports (PBIS), as our foundation in guiding our students towards self-regulation.

PBIS is a proactive approach, to create a safe, responsible and respectful environment for our students to learn. It focuses on teaching and reinforcing positive behaviours based on a belief that all students can learn pro-social behaviour when provided with clear expectations and consistent support.

In this issue, let's take a look at how PBIS creates a culture of safety in Katong School.

#### 1. Setting Clear Expectations


PBIS begins with establishing clear expectations for expected behaviours in school. By defining what it means to be safe in various school settings, such as the classrooms, foyer, and the canteen, students know exactly what is expected of them. This helps to ensure that everyone understands their role in maintaining a safe environment.

#### 2. Adopting a Proactive Approach

PBIS takes a proactive approach to safety by teaching and reinforcing pro-social behaviour. Through explicit instruction, modelling and practice, students learn to make safe choices. By emphasizing on pro-social behaviours, PBIS helps mitigate potential safety concerns before they escalate.

#### 3. Speaking a Common Language

Ensuring safety within the school environment is a collaborative effort that involves students, staff and parents. Using the PBIS approach as an entire school community, helps to provide a set of baseline habits and behaviour that is expected in our students.

5 Healthy Habits to Nurture PBIS:
Being Safe @ Home and in the Community

#### 1. Establish Clear Expectations

Set clear expectations for safe behaviour at home. Discuss with your children what it means to be safe in various settings, such as at home, in public, or online. Make sure your expectations are age-appropriate and consistently reinforced.

#### 2. Model Safe Behaviour

Children learn by example, so it is essential for parents to model safe behaviour in their daily lives. Demonstrate safe practices such as wearing seat belts in the car, using traffic lights when crossing the street and following safety guidelines at home. Explain the reasons behind safety rules and the importance of making safe choices.

#### 3. Use Positive Reinforcement

Recognise and praise your children for making safe choices and following safety rules at home. Use positive reinforcement techniques such as verbal praise, hugs, or small rewards to reinforce desired behaviours. Celebrate their successes and acknowledge their efforts to prioritize safety.

#### 4. Create a Safe Environment

Take steps to create a safe physical environment at home by securing hazardous items, and storing medications and cleaning products out of reach. Teach your children about potential dangers in the home and how to avoid accidents or injuries.

#### 5. Collaborate with School

Stay informed about Katong School's PBIS safety practices and collaborate with teachers to reinforce safety messages at home. Discuss safety-related topics covered in school and reinforce these messages at home to ensure consistency between home and school environments.

# Total Defence Day 2024: Disruption Exercise & Learning Journey


15 Feb 2024 marks 40 years of Total Defence (TD40) in Singapore, since it was first introduced in 1984. The theme for this year's Total Defence campaign - "Together We Keep Singapore Strong" - focuses on the many ways we can put Total Defence into action in our everyday lives.

KS commemorated the event with a lockdown drill as well as simulated energy and water disruptions.

We went on our first learning journey on 20 February as the Primary School students embarked on a learning journey to Blk 58 Upper Changi Road, Bedok Mall and Heartbeat @ Bedok. Meanwhile, the Secondary School students took public transport to Our Tampines Hub to learn more about how the 6 aspects of Total Defence promotes a sense of national unity, resilience and preparedness.







### <u>Secondary 1:</u> DLS Learning Journey
