APSN'S INCLUSIVE RUNWAY SHOW ELEVATES DISABILITY AWARENESS WITH SUPPORT FROM CORPORATE 'GIANTS'

Celebrating how every partner, donor, and beneficiary forms part of Singapore's inclusive social fabric

Singapore, 28 November 2025 – APSN's Charity Fashion Gala 2025, themed "Threads of Aspiration", brought together more than 300 partners, donors, and supporters last evening to champion vocational pathways and social inclusion for persons with mild intellectual disability. Graced by Guest-of-Honour Dr Tan See Leng, Minister for Manpower, the gala raised funds to expand APSN's training and employment programmes aimed at strengthening Singapore's inclusive workforce.

From runway pieces co-created by APSN beneficiaries and Temasek Polytechnic students to the live auction of a Liverpool FC jersey signed by Trent Alexander-Arnold and Andy Robertson, the evening was filled with creativity, purpose and energy. Adding to the excitement, Miss Universe Singapore 2025, Ms Annika Sager, and her fellow runner-ups and finalists joined the APSN Inclusive Ensemble in a performance that symbolised unity across talent, inclusivity, and community.

APSN's Chaoyang School presented their Beijing cultural exchange performance once again, after first showcasing it before distinguished embassy and foreign delegates.

Anchoring the night was the debut of the APSN Giants Awards, which honoured nine corporate and community partners for their outstanding contributions in Philanthropy, Advocacy, Volunteering, and Employment (PAVE). Their support has made a tangible impact on APSN's mission and helped pave crucial pathways to independence for our beneficiaries. These awardees are true "Giants" of the community—lending not only resources, but also credibility, expertise, and vital industry access. Diagnosed with mild intellectual disability, Carol once struggled with confidence and daily challenges, but with APSN's training and employer partnerships, she now thrives as a Public Area Attendant at Hotel Indigo, a brand under APSN Giants Gold awardee IHG Hotels & Resorts.

Not only has Carol worked towards an independent life and career, but her growing confidence has also spilled over into many other aspects of her life. In 2023, with the support of her teachers, she represented Singapore as a delegate at the Special Olympics World Games in Berlin, Germany competing in the 400m race and mini javelin events. Tonight, she returned as a model — stepping onto the runway with pride and demonstrating what becomes possible when individuals are given the opportunity to shine.

With this network of schools, centres, and support services, APSN provides comprehensive care for individuals at all stages of life.

Under the patronage of Ms Jane Ittogi, APSN continues to expand its reach and impact, partnering with organisations to create a more inclusive environment for all. APSN has attained the Enabling Mark (Gold), a national-level accreditation framework by SG Enable that benchmarks and recognises organisations for their best practices and outcomes in disability-inclusive employment.
